Some of you will have been at the conference and AGM of Alzheimer Scotland at Murrayfield on 1 November where it was good to hear of the successes of the past year. Henry Simmons (Chief Executive) spoke about what had been achieved through policy and campaigning; the ongoing dialogue with the Scottish Government to help develop the National Dementia Strategy, delivering quality services, information and outreach (including the 24 hour Dementia Helpline and the mobile information vehicles) and advice and support through Dementia Advisors, Dementia Champions and Dementia Nurses. Fundraising through events, appeals, legacies and partnerships with charitable trusts and corporate supporters has made this work possible. The Annual Review is well worth a read. It will be sent to members with the next edition of Dementia in Scotland and will also be on the website. Henry Simmons also spoke about a more local focus for Alzheimer Scotland in the future; engaging with local members, local strategic fundraising and policy development. This will be supported by the new post of Deputy Regional Manager. I trust that you will help the Branch to play a part in this more local focus.

I reported in September that a Dementia Resource Centre for Edinburgh is being given serious consideration. Such centres in other towns are helping to remove the cloak of secrecy and stigma from dementia and bring information and support into the heart of the community. The search continues for suitable premises in Edinburgh.

On a personal note I have been a member of the

Council of Alzheimer Scotland for three years but have decided not to seek re-election. Significant changes to the Council (voted through at the AGM) mean an increase in meetings to which I cannot commit. My loyalty remains to the Edinburgh Branch and I think I can use my time better to supporting the Branch in the (hoped for) transition to being a valuable partner in the Resource Centre for Edinburgh.
