# West Calder High School - YPI

YPI (Youth and Philanthropy Initiative Scotland) is a structured curricular programme, designed for secondary schools, centred on youth voice, youth action and youth philanthropy. Small teams of students identify the social needs of their local community. They then research the area and contact the group they would like to benefit. This provides the team with a more detailed understanding of what the potential benefactors do.



The teams then prepare a presentation on the findings and the winning team are given £3000 for the group they are backing. In this case the team picked the Alzheimer Scotland West Lothian Resource Centre and spoke to Cherie Raby the Dementia Advisor. As you can see from the photograph the team supporting us came out triumphant. Cherie said, 'I have been working with this team and it is fantastic news, I am over the moon' The monies will be used to build up every day resources for meaningful activities to be used at the Resource Centre on a regular basis, like art materials, music, games etc.
