Active Voices – West Lothian Commissioning Plans

Following on from the Integrated Joint Board Strategy Consultation, the older peoples commissioning plan for West Lothian sets out how services for older people and those living with dementia, will be commissioned and developed over the next 4 years.

It is very important that the development of local services takes account of the local needs of those living with dementia and how they will be delivered in a more integrated way, to improve the quality of support for people who need them and deliver the national health and wellbeing outcomes.

We have arranged an engagement session on this topic, where you will have the opportunity to have your say on how services for those living with dementia and carers, will be shaped in West Lothian. Fair Dementia Open Day

Right now, people living with advanced dementia are facing £50.9m in care costs.

- Form filling assisting with the following claim forms Attendance Allowance, Personal Independence Payment, Council Tax Reduction, Housing Benefit, Employment and Support Allowance and Carers Allowance.
- General advice on housing issues problems with landlords, rent arrears etc.
- General advice on energy issues problems with bills. (Please note we cannot recommend energy suppliers)
- General money advice assistance with debt problems. (Please note we do not give financial advice with regards to pensions or tax)

Flu Vaccine

Scotland's Chief Medical Officer recommends that people have the free flu vaccine every year if they:

- * have a health condition (no matter what age they are or how fit and healthy they feel)
- * are aged 65 or over.

Adults with a health condition are more at risk of flu-related complications and need extra protection. The vaccine is the most effective way to help protect people against flu.

People over the age of 65 should get a letter in the post (or have just received one), prompting them to contact their GP to make an appointment to receive their free flu vaccination. However, people under 65 with an existing health condition may not receive a letter (but they are still entitled to a free vaccine through their GP).
