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#### **News from Wester Ross**

**Latest update from Nick Gardner**, incredible carer, mountain climber and fundraiser from Wester Ross.

Nick says 'When my dear wife, Janet, was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease and Osteoporosis, I wanted to do something to benefit sufferers and carers everywhere.

I was 80 in April 2020 and my challenge was to raise £50,000 for Alzheimer Scotland and the Royal Osteoporosis Society by climbing the 282 Munros (Scottish mountains over 3000 feet) in 1200 days.

Sadly Janet passed away in December 2022.

Fortunately I was able to complete my challenge and surpass my fundraising target. I completed the challenge on 13th August 2022 (in less than 800 days) and raised over £80,000.

I was delighted to win the Just Giving Fundraised of the Year 2022 in the Endurance category.



Christine McCallum, Post Diagnostic Support Link Worker also sent us more news about Nick. 'I thought I'd share this news from Nick.

It's another award!!!!! This time for the film makers in Fort William who made the film 'Moving Mountains' telling Nick's incredible story.'

"Moving Mountains" directed by Aoife McKibbin won the People's Choice Award, as chosen by the crowd at the International Film Night in February this year. So far, Nick's JustGiving page has raised £84,252 for Alzheimer Scotland and the Royal Osteoporosis Society.
